This is a cost-saving measure, and allows for the content to direct the number of pages utilized for the publication. Please remember submissions are always welcomed.

**Philanthropic Report** given by 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Cindy Norman

I received 2 state recommendation forms on time, they were from Gamma Pi, Indianapolis and Alpha Zeta, Fort Wayne, they both were to keep Camp Riley and Anna's Celebration of Life as our State projects. I sent the information to my committee and they looked them over, so no voting at convention!

Moving on to ACOLF. We have sent 8 gifts to kids waiting to receive their gifts from Anna's. Brad said he will have some more names to Cindy soon. If you would like to be added to the list to send a gift just let me know, it can be a chapter or as individuals. I had an email blast sent out about the St. Patrick's Day Parade in downtown Indianapolis on March 17, 2022. So

far there is just me and Mary Clark going but we would love to have more members join us. The parade starts at 11:30am and should end about 12:30pm, meeting time is 10:30 at North St. and Pennsylvania and ends at North St. and Meridian. This is the first year ACOLF has participated in the parade.

Now to Camp Riley. We have a new Community Fundraising Coordinator for Camp Riley, her name is Melissa Sexton. She is here to talk to us today about Camp Riley. Bradford Woods has decided to build a permanent dock instead of the floating dock we were working towards. The permanent dock is \$70,000.00 but will last many more years; we have \$35,538.00 raised so far without any totals from this year. Cindy asked Melissa to explain all that. They are going to have camp this year and we will get to have a Camp Riley Day. Cindy will work with Melissa to get a date figured out. We are also going to be able to get t- shirts again this year, and they are working on getting us a price and sizechart so I can get that information to everyone.

Please remember to get your philanthropic report to Cindy by May 15, 2022.

Cindy introduced Melissa Sexton from Camp Riley who shared that:

Fishing Dock – A cost analysis was done, a review of who uses the dock, maintenance costs and comparison of a 20 year floating dock vs a 30 year permanent dock. Bradford Woods will raise the difference if ESA cannot raise the full \$70,000 with ESA maintaining naming rights.

Camperships are still needed.

New project options are a learning kitchen (\$40,000 with naming option), outdoor lighting (\$12,000), outdoor play space (\$35,000 with naming option) or archery range (\$10,000).

Cindy introduced Brad Haberman from ACOLF who shared that:

The pandemic has allowed us the opportunity to redefine how ACOLF does what it does. 2022 will be celebrating 16 years. In 2020 60 – 70 gifts were given to children. In 2021 74 gifts were given to children. The goal for 2022 is to give 100+ gifts to children. iPads are in high demand with very low supply due to supply chain issues. It takes 9 weeks to get an iPad directly from Apple.

Turnaround Funds - this is a simple way to support our ESA Foundation:

Rather than sending individual checks to one or more 501c3 charities, the individual sends one check to the Foundation indicating which charity is to receive what amount. The Foundation turns around this request and sends individual checks back to the person using the turnaround funds. Then the person sends the checks to the individual charities. Note: Checks are returned to the donor, not to the charity, so the donor needs to send them on to the charity.

Membership Options and Dues:

- Annual dues were due to ESA Headquarters **before** March 1 but it is not too late to join. All ESAF members were asked to stand.
- General membership is just as important as Life Active Membership.
- Members of the Foundation do not need to be ESA members!
- It is only \$25 to join and \$15 per year annually.
- It's never been easier to join or renew online via the Member suite
