Guest Speaker, Make-A-Wish	Jennifer Skinner

As some of you may know, I've been a Wish Granter with Make-A-Wish for several years, I've served on the Emerging Leaders board, and volunteered in other aspects. I would like to share more about Make-A-Wish with all of you because I really enjoy it! It's a great opportunity and you can help from anywhere in the state. I would now like to introduce you to Leah Covert, our local Indiana Volunteer Engagement Specialist. If you brought any donations, we'll be sending them with her today.

Leah talked about the History of Make A Wish which was started by a mom with a sick child, whose dying wish was to be a police officer. MAW is 40 years old and OKI (Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana) chapter is the largest in the world (based on the number of wish kids – due to the number of children's hospitals in the OKI area). In 2023, this chapter will grant over 1200 wishes. The #1 wish is Disney but an impactful kind of wish is the "I wish to give..." where the child grants a wish that helps others like a playground or something. MAW works with other wish granting organizations to make the kids as happy as possible. She talked about Disney having many in-kind donations and the GIVE KIDS THE WORLD resort. The wishes that cannot be granted have gun or hunting involved but they work with an organization who can do that type of wish. Ways to volunteer are wish granting, celebration boxes, donating airline miles, special events, donations and sponsors.
