

Some VERY IMPORTANT dates and things to know:

- August 1 through December 31st State and IC dues must be paid by this date to be considered on time.
 These forms are on the Indiana ESA website. (Easy to bring me a check at Fall Conference)
- September 15: Tax facts forms must be SUBMITTED by September 15 to ESA Headquarters via mail or email (no faxes).

If you donated \$5,000 or more to any ONE charity this year you are required to submit an addendum with your tax facts form. These forms are on the Indiana ESA website as well with detailed instructions on how to fill them out. The TAX Facts form is vitally important to ESA chapters and councils because completion of the form by the annual September 15th deadline, along with on-time payment of the chapter/council's International Council dues allows ESA's International Council to report financial information for the chapter/council and eliminates the need for a for the chapter (council) to file a chapter (council) IRS return.

Please reach out to me if you have any questions or need help. Just like the little train, "I think we can, I think we can, I think we can" get all our dues and Tax facts in on time!

ESA for St. Jude Senior Coordinator Aphrodite Hudson



Hello! I am Aphrodite, your Sr. St. Jude coordinator for the 25-26 year. I have a feeling this is going to be a very exciting year, and I am looking forward to seeing what amazing things the membership does to continue our efforts to support St. Jude.

In case you missed it, or did not receive/open the email from corporate a few weeks ago, St. Jude has asked ESA to shift our direction going forward. It has been determined that shifting the focus to cash donations matters more than ever, and is anticipated to provide better care to the patients. They have asked us to commit to raising \$5 million over the next 4 years. Successfully meeting this ambitious goal will be recognized with ESA being included in a new outdoor space on the hospital grounds.

This is our 57th year of the ESA-ST. Jude partnership. To celebrate that, and to kick-start our fundraising efforts, it has been suggested we focus on birthdays and celebrations. Throw a birthday party and ask for donations in lieu of gifts, donate on behalf of friends and family for their birthdays, celebrate chapter and state birthdays with donations. Donations don't have to be limited to birthdays, any special occasion that is a cause to celebrate can be a donation/contribution opportunity.

Other changes to highlight- the ALSAC Tier system for volunteer hours has been retired. Hours will be tracked separately. ALL ALSAC volunteer hours have to be logged in the Volunteer Management System for all ALSAC hosted events. Non-ALSAC hosted events should be logged in the VMS as well to receive credit. They will not be tracked/counted if not logged into the VMS. Please take some time to educate yourself on how to maximize the credit earned by watching some of the Micro Learning Lessons in the Education Center of the ESA headquarters website. While there, go ahead and register for the VMS to claim the recognition you all deserve for the hard work you do.

You will have to log into the member center on the ESA headquarters website in order to access the VMS and the Education Center. Once logged in, scroll down and look for the heading "Working with ESA partners section"

I am honored to be the Educational Director for the 2025-2026 year! For those who may not know me that well, I want to share a little bit about me.



As you likely heard (since you are receiving a copy of this newsletter) ESA Membership Corporation privacy rules have required us to change how we create and manage our contact lists. All members who wish to receive the e-blasts and The LAMP must now complete a one-time opt-in form.

If you received this publication because it was forwarded to you but did not directly receive it in your email inbox, it is likely you are not subscribed/opted in. Please email me at iscesacorresponding@gmail.com and I can assist you. Chapter Presidents have shared the link with current members who use email. The PIP Chair has also provided members of the PIP Auxiliary with the link. I've answered some Frequently Asked Questions below.

Will we need to opt-in/subscribe every year? Nope! One time is all it takes. You can also unsubscribe at any time, using the link at the bottom of each message sent from The LAMP Editor account or the Corresponding Secretary account. Please note, unsubscribing will remove you from both communications.

How do pledges/new members subscribe?

Chapter Presidents should provide the opt-in link to new members or they can request the link by emailing iscesacorresponding@gmail.com

Can I sign up for my chapter brother/sister?

No. Individual members must complete their own opt-ins and cannot register for someone else.

I'm a chapter president and one of our members quit. Do I need to do anything?

Yes. Please email iscesacorresponding@gmail.com with the member's first and last name. Administrators will remove that individual from the contact group.

I think I opted in, but I'm not getting the messages.

If you received the email with this LAMP publication directly from the LAMP editor email, you did and are good to go. If you aren't getting the e-blasts from the corresponding secretary email account, first check your spam/junk folder. If you don't see the messages there, send me an email at iscesacorresponding@gmail.com

My chapter sister/brother said they aren't getting the messages.

Please see instructions in the prior question.

I've been pleased with subscriber rates, but we do have some members who have not yet opted in. While it is not required and not all members wish to receive the communications, we aim to ensure nobody who wishes to receive them is left out, and that anyone who is no longer a member does not. Thank you so much for your patience and flexibility as we transition to this new method. I'm so grateful for all of you! Please don't hesitate to reach out to me at any time with questions.

Anyone uploading or filling in identification data will need a Google account. However, if the photographers in your chapter do not wish to create a google account, other sharing options are available upon request.


