Transportation in Indiana: Journey of travel

**The railroad and interurban era (late 1800s - mid-1900s)**

**Railroads:** The state's first major railroad, the Madison and Indianapolis Railroad, spurred the construction of other lines. The Monon Railroad, nicknamed the "Hoosier Line," was another crucial freight and passenger carrier.

**Interurbans:** Indiana was a national leader in electric interurban railways, which connected cities and rural areas from the 1890s to the 1940s.

These lines carried passengers and freight, allowing people to travel for day trips and trade. The extensive networks also helped spread electricity to smaller towns.

**Decline:** The rise of the automobile and the interstate highway system contributed to the decline of most interurban lines, with the South Shore Line being the last classic interurban in operation today.

**Modern era (1900s - present)**

**Public transit:** Indianapolis Railways took over public transit in the 1930s and was renamed the Indianapolis Transit System in 1953 before operations ceased in 1972.

**Highways:** The Indiana State Highway Commission was created in 1919, evolving into the Indiana Department of Highways in 1981 and finally the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) in 1989.

**Museums:** The Indiana Transportation Museum in Logansport preserves historical railroad and trolley equipment. Unfortunately, this museum closed its doors in 2023, however the Whitewater Valley Railroad is trying to keep the history alive and offers heritage railroad excursions from Connersville, Indiana. They also host special events, such as the official THE POLAR EXPRESS™ Train Ride. The Monon Connection Museum and Whistle Stop Restaurant focus is specifically on the history of the Monon Railroad. This would be an amazing daytrip or social to learn more about this amazing portion of Indiana's Journey!

Thank you to the chapters that have submitted educationals so far! The topics are broad and I have enjoyed learning about more of the ESA start with Literature presentations to Womens Health, Non-profit organizations and exploring and finding the Joy within ESA!

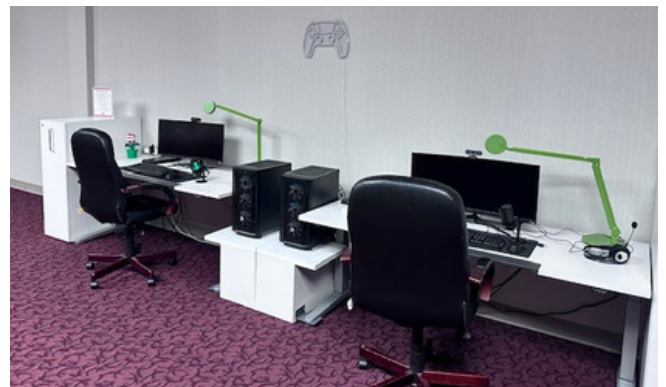

## Easterseals Special Project continued ...

### Sensory Garden:

Pavers with your name on it - \$500-\$10K (could be by chapter or ESA as a whole)

Lighting - \$15K

Bench/Name - \$25K. There will be a deck with rotating exhibits just off the promenade pathway, which will go through the garden from the beginning to the end. The bench would be placed on or next to the deck which would have your name on it.

Promenade Pathway - \$50K. Would have your bench and name the whole path after ESA.

Water Bubbler - \$75K. This would be one of the sensory components.

### Gaming Studio:

Tabletop gaming - \$15,000: This space will feature a wide variety of board games, offering participants a chance to engage and strategize over tabletop fun. Your brand will be highlighted within the library space and recognized through social media and the annual report.

Retro Gaming Zone - \$25,000: This would include old video and arcade games. This list is not a final selection of games, only suggested ones:

#### • **Note from Easterseals**

Currently, we maintain a list of approximately 100 individuals who are invited to participate in our events. We see an average attendance of 12-15 participants per event. Our goal is to increase that average to 20-25 participants per event over the next 12 months. This will be accomplished by offering more gaming options, public awareness and improved accessibility.

Our long-term goal is to transition from our current, small gaming room to a larger, dedicated space within Easterseals Crossroads. This expansion will allow us to serve more individuals and increase the frequency and variety of gaming events offered. By creating a more accessible gaming space, we can better support the social and emotional development of those we serve. Individuals with disabilities find that connecting through gaming allows them to engage in conversation and interact with others. I like what we have started, it's pretty cool!

Everyone we serve, including our staff, is welcome to enjoy the Sensory Garden. It's designed to be a calm, inviting place where people can relax and enjoy the outdoors. There will be sensory-friendly features, peaceful spots to sit and unwind and a walking path. The garden will also be available for community and public events.

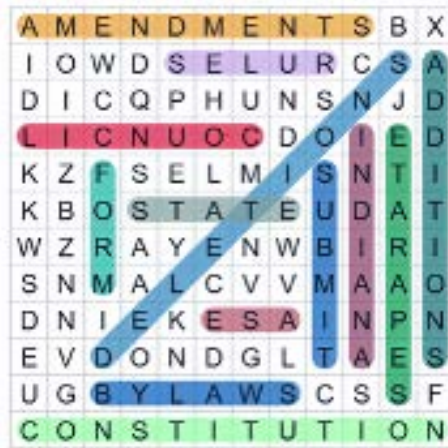

As this year's journey winds to a close, let's pause to reflect on all the moments that made it meaningful — the laughter, the hugs, and the time shared both inside and outside ESA events.

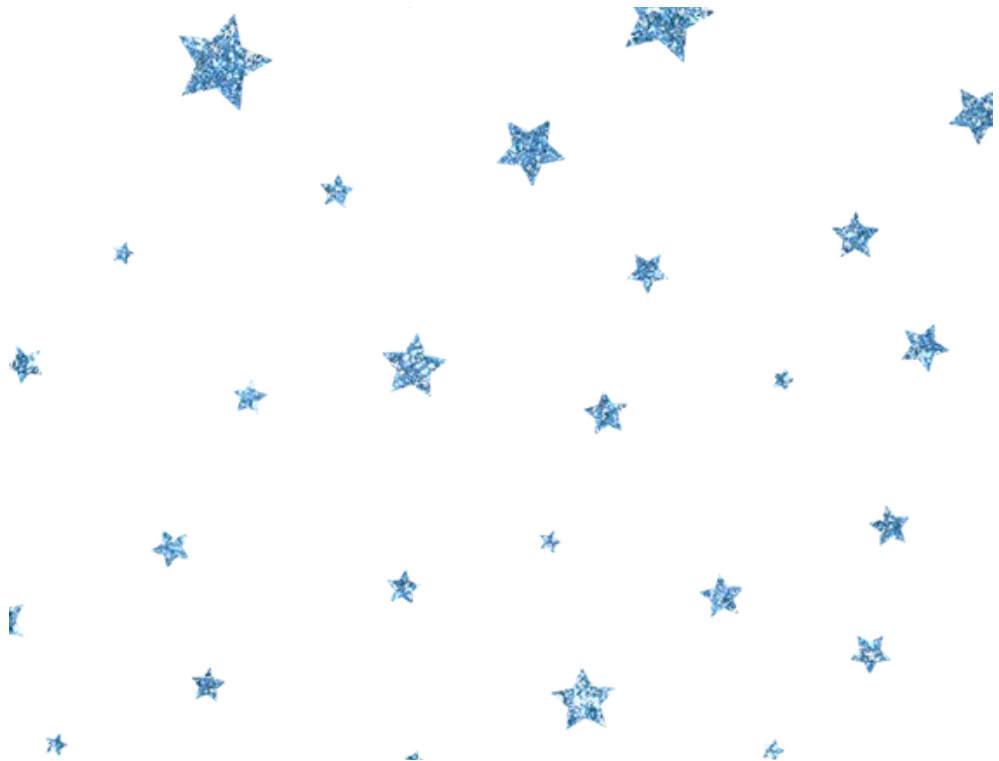

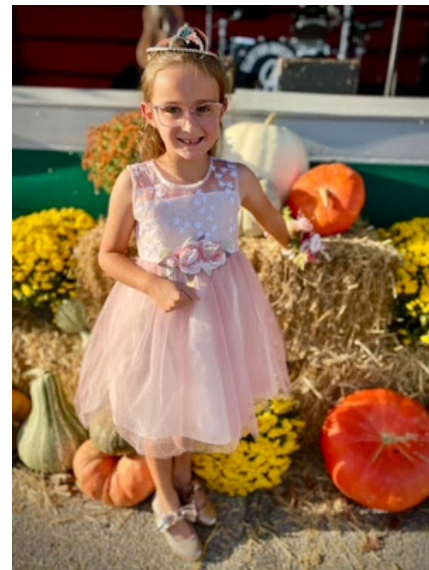


### **Delta Delta, Seymour**
