ARTICLE III - DUTIES OF ELECTED OFFICERS

Section 6. The Parliamentarian shall assist the President in Parliamentary Procedure when requested; appoint and be chairman of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee; receive proposed amendments for the Constitution, Bylaws, and Standing Rules from chapters in good standing by January 1 of each year; present them to the Executive Board; send the amended Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules to the newly installed Indiana State Council President within thirty (30) days of the Annual State Convention to be included in the President's Yearbook.

There are a few appointed board positions still needing to be filled. If you would like to serve on the board in one of these positions, please contact me ASAP. I am happy to meet one on one with you to discuss board opportunities. We would love to have you on ISC's board!

Unique and Interesting facts about TRAINS

1. One locomotive weighs about as much as 108 hippos. Tier 4 locomotives weigh a whopping 432,000 pounds — the same as 108 hippos weighing in at 4,000 pounds each. These 6-axle engines have 4,400 traction horsepower and can reach a maximum speed of 70 miles per hour pulling thousands of tons of freight.
2. Train symbolism revolves around journeys, time, progress, and destiny, representing life's path, societal changes (modernity/industrialization), structured movement (tracks vs. free roads), and even spiritual or personal transitions, often highlighting themes of connection, isolation, or predetermined fate. It embodies movement, representing both hope and the inevitability of change, with elements like tracks signifying destiny and passengers reflecting social dynamics.
3. Toy train sets help children develop valuable skills. Storytelling, creative thinking, dexterity, vocabulary, teamwork, turn-taking, mathematics
4. Bullet Trains Float: Some modern "maglev" trains in Japan use magnets to hover just above the track, eliminating friction to reach speeds up to 375 mph.
5. The Longest Railway: The Trans-Siberian Railway in Russia is the longest, stretching over 5,700 miles. Only continent that does not have trains is Antarctica, due to the cold and icy conditions that would make the railways unsafe.

Greetings!

I have a very important update regarding Indiana e-blast and LAMP emails. You may recall that we implemented the communications opt-in system last June as a response to the inability to collect chapter rosters or otherwise obtain member emails. All who completed that online Indiana opt-in form receive the twice-monthly e-blast and The LAMP. Beginning April 1, the Indiana opt-in system will no longer be active and the recipient list will be generated from a report prepared by ESAMC (formerly Headquarters).

Why is this happening? It's quite exciting! ESAMC has developed a way for state communicators to access email addresses for members who have not opted out of communications from their state councils. For all members who have an email address on file with ESAMC, the default for all communication types is opted-in. To ensure these preferences are managed in one location, any updates now must be made in Member Center, not directly with the individual state leadership.

What does this mean for you? If you opted-in using the Indiana form since it was distributed in June and are a member in good standing (having paid your annual dues to Epsilon Sigma Alpha International), you likely won't notice a thing! The only difference will be the footer at the bottom of each email from the Corresponding Secretary and LAMP accounts. The link for changing your communication preferences will now direct you to log into Member Center on the ESA website, rather than to an Indiana managed form.

If you opted-in but are no longer a member in good standing with ESA (you have not paid your dues or are not a life active member), beginning April 1 you may no longer receive the Indiana ESA communications. Any time an individual rolls off the member report, the president of that member's chapter will be contacted to allow that member time to reinstate their membership, but when these efforts fail, that individual, by virtue of no longer being a member, will be removed from the Indiana ESA communications.

If you did not opt-in using the Indiana online form this year but have not opted out of state communications in Member Center on the Epsilon Sigma Alpha website (not the Indiana ESA website), you should have received a welcome email the first week of March from iscesacorresponding@gmail.com explaining that you've been added to Indiana communications distribution. That email explained why you were added and included detailed instructions on how to opt-out of those communications if you wish to do so. You also will have received this LAMP issue directly, not through a chapter member forwarding it to you.

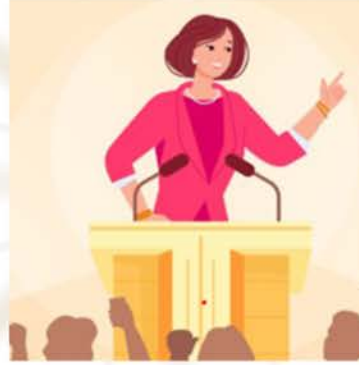
Chapter Presidents and Treasurers: Be sure you are checking ESAMC member rosters for your chapter periodically and comparing that to your internal roster. While reconciling the Indiana managed subscriber list and the ESAMC member report, it was discovered that some who opted in are not members in good standing. In some cases, these individuals recently lapsed on their dues and simply needed a reminder, but some had been lapsed for several years. It's certainly easy to forget about membership dues or overlook a reminder email, but we want to ensure communications that may contain member addresses or other personal details are only received by active ESA members. Please review paragraph 4 above for more information and please check your chapter rosters so you can alert members when they "fall off" the roster due to non-payment.

I know change is hard, and believe me, when I realized this meant a different process to learn and execute monthly, I was not thrilled. However, sometimes change is necessary, and thankfully, Mackeigan Bickel at ESAMC prepared an amazing Standard Operating Procedure document of step-by-step instructions, which will remain in the procedures manual for my successors.

Proposal #1.1

Bylaws

Action: Add to Article XII:

Signing Checks All checks and other orders for the payment of money issued in the name of the Indiana State Council shall be signed by the Treasurer. The President must also be listed as a signing agent on all checking and savings accounts with the banks handling the funds for the Indiana State Council of Epsilon Sigma Alpha International, Inc.

Signing Contracts and Other Instruments Only the Treasurer and President can sign contracts and agreements for the Indiana State Council, provided they have the approval of the Executive Board. This includes any contracts for new philanthropic projects or fundraising events held by the Indiana State Council.

Reason: to move all language about financial and contract authority to one standalone section with other financial procedures. Also, make the language more concise.

Proposal #1.2

Bylaws Article III Section 1 subsection c

Action: Delete

c. Along with the Treasurer, the President must approve any contracts signed on behalf of the Indiana State Council, including contracts for any new philanthropic projects or fundraising events held by the Indiana State Council before the contract is signed.

Reason: to remove duplication of content as has been relocated to Article XII

Proposal #1.3

Bylaws Article III Section 5

The Treasurer shall be bonded by an accredited bonding company (amount and company to be approved by the Executive Board), receive all monies, pay all bills (approved by the Executive Board) and have the books audited two weeks prior to the Annual State Convention. The signature of the President and Treasurer will be placed on file for the checking and savings accounts with the banks handling the Funds for the Indiana State Council of Epsilon Sigma Alpha International, Inc. Shall serve on the Budget Committee. Shall appoint a Credentials Committee and serve as its chairman. Along with the President, the Treasurer must approve any contracts signed on behalf of the Indiana State Council, including contracts for any new philanthropic projects or fundraising events held by the Indiana State Council before the contract is signed.

Reason: to remove duplication of content as has been relocated to Article XII

Proposal #2

Bylaws Article II Section 1a. (Elections)a. With the exception of Treasurer, all officers They shall assume their duties at the close of the Annual State Convention and continue in office until the close of the next Annual State Convention. The Treasurer shall assume their duties at the start of the fiscal year and continue in office until the end of that fiscal year.

Reason: Change to indicate Treasurer will serve until end of fiscal year.

Proposal #3

BylawsArticle II Section 1 b. (Elections)b.No officer shall succeed herself or himself in the same office. An officer is eligible to be nominated to succeed himself or herself only if, by the time of the vote at the Annual State Convention, no qualified nominations have been received for that office. The officer may serve in this capacity for no longer than two (2) consecutive terms.

Reason: To allow for a vacancy to be filled with incumbent if no other nominations are received. To set a term limit.

Proposal #4.1

BylawsArticle IV. Section 2The State LAMP Editor shall edit and publish the State Paper quarterly for the Indiana State Council; mail or e-mail a copy to each member in good standing; keep a copy of each issue of The LAMP on file at all times.; submit for approval to the Executive Board a financial report of the costs of editing, publishing, and mailing issues of the LAMP.

Reason: To bring into alignment with current operating procedures. The LAMP is distributed by email. Members in good standing may request a print copy be mailed but that quantity can fluctuate throughout the year. The budget committee determines appropriate budgeted amount each year based on demand and availability of free copying. The LAMP Editor submits bills following requirements for reimbursement.

Proposal #4.2

BylawsStanding Rule #5Bids for publication of THE LAMP shall be presented at the February Board Meeting and contract shall be prepared for acceptance by the Executive Board.

Action: Delete. Reason: To bring into alignment with current operating procedures. The LAMP is distributed by email. Members in good standing may request a print copy be mailed but that quantity can fluctuate throughout year. Budget committee can determine appropriate budgeted amount each year based on demand and availability of free copying.

Proposal #5

BylawsArticle IV Section 3The State Chaplain shall be informed of the death of any ESA member or their immediate family (the immediate family to be husband, children, mother, and father). Shall assist in the sorority remembrance activities for a member at the request of the member's family or chapter. Executive Board.

Reason: removing the word sorority and clarifying type of activity Chaplain may assist with and that it is only upon death of member, not member's family member. To clarify who may request Chaplain's assistance.

Proposal #6

Bylaws Article V. Section 1 If an applicable year, the President shall appoint an ESA Foundation Counselor for a term of two (2) years. The ESA Foundation Counselor shall keep the Indiana State Council and the membership informed of Foundation activities.

Reason: Because it is a 2-year appointment, this is not something that should be written as if it occurs annually. Further to clarify who shall keep the Indiana State Council and membership informed of Foundation activities.

Proposal #7

Bylaws Article VI (Automatic Office) The Junior Past President shall be a member of the Executive Board, responsible for obtaining new rosters from each chapter in good standing postmarked by May 15; be chair for the program "Outstanding ESA Member of the Year"; and be in charge of the Disaster Fund and Hope for Heroes. The Junior Past President shall record the outstanding events while serving as President by inserting a page in the "History of Indiana State Council of Epsilon Sigma Alpha" book.

Reason: To bring into alignment with current operating procedures. Rosters are no longer permitted by ESAMC to be collected.

Proposal #8

Bylaws Article VII. Section 4 The quorum of the Executive Board shall be eight (8) a majority of eligible voting members.

Reason: To remove a specific number and replace it with "majority" as there may be instances when the size of the executive board varies. Furthermore, the number 8 does not currently align with being the required majority of number of officers designated as being members of Executive Board as described in Article VII Section 1.

Proposal #9

Bylaws Article VIII Section 1 (current version does not have bullet points) The Nominating Committee shall consist of the First Vice President who shall be chairman and one (1) representative from three (3) other chapters. a. They shall receive nominations from chapters for the elected offices by January 1 of each year. b. They shall receive from the chapters by January 1 of each year, bids for the location to hold the Spring and Fall Conferences and the Annual State Convention. They shall present names of all qualified nominees, cities of the Annual State Convention and conferences at the Annual State Convention. c. In the event names are not submitted for elected offices, they shall select qualified nominees. d. This committee shall prepare ballots for Annual State Convention. Chapters bidding for Conferences, Annual State Conventions, and Chapters nominating a candidate must pay their state dues by January 1, and chapters' candidate's membership dues must be paid. If dues of chapter nominating a candidate are not paid by January 1, or nomination form not received by January 1, candidate may be nominated from the floor. Included with the letter of qualifications for the candidate shall be verifications of payments of the Chapter's State and International Council dues and the candidate's State and International Council dues.

Reason: Underline Nominating Committee and add bullet points to use same format as other sections outlining committees. To arrange responsibilities into format that is easier to read and interpret. To remove language that is referenced elsewhere in Bylaws Article 1 Section 2 (Conferences); Constitution Article V Section 2 (Conventions); Bylaws Article II Section 5 (Officers) as these are not a task description for committee.

Proposal #10

Bylaws

Article VIII Section 2

The Elections Committee shall consist of the First Vice President who shall be chairman and one (1) representative from three (3) four (4) other chapters. They shall open the polls at the close of the First General Assembly on the second day of the Annual State Convention and close the polls at 1 o'clock the same day one (1) hour following the adjournment of the first general assembly, count the ballots, and give the tellers' report to the President.

Reason: add "The" to match formatting of other committee descriptions, change number of committee members required to align with number required for all other committees. Change description of when polls will be closed to avoid a specific time of day and remove reference to second day of convention in the event there would not be Friday convention activities.

Proposal #11

Bylaws Article VIII Section 3

The Credentials Committee shall consist of the Treasurer who shall be chairman and one (1) representative from three (3) other chapters.members. They shall audit the Treasurer who shall be Chairman. They shall check credentials of delegates, issue ballots to delegates, and report the number of voting members present.

Reason: Change sequence of committee composition to match that of other committees in this section. To clarify members must be from three different chapters, not including the Treasurer's own. Remove reference to audit; this is addressed in procedure manual.

Proposal #12

Bylaws Article VIII Section 4

The Auditing Committee shall consist of the Treasurer and one (1) representative from three (3) other chapters.members. They shall audit the Treasurer's books two (2) weeks prior to the winter board meeting in January and two (2) weeks prior to the Annual State Convention. A final audit shall be made within two weeks of the end of the fiscal year. two (2) weeks after convention.

Reason: Change sequence and language of committee composition to match that of other committees in this section. To clarify members must be from three different chapters, not including the Treasurer's own. To remove specific month reference for winter audit. Change final audit description to be relative to fiscal year end rather than convention date.

Proposal #13

Bylaws Article XI Section 1

International—The current State President's registration and travel expenses to attend the International Convention. The travel expenses would include: *round trip flight or mileage according to the current non-profit mileage rate if driving; *half of the total hotel room cost (including the night prior and the night(s) during the convention);

*meals (including the PICPA Meal), excluding alcohol; *and miscellaneous fees such as parking, shuttle, and tips. If the current State President is unable to attend, the following order of representation shall apply: First Vice President, Second Vice President, Treasurer, Junior Past President, and a Past Indiana State President.

Action: Move to Article X, Expenditures, label as Section 1, subsection f. Reason: *This bylaw outlines an expenditure and should be grouped with other bylaws related to spending. If the above proposed change to move Article XI Section 1 to Article X Section 1 f, passes, the reference indicated in Article XVI: Voting for State Purposes, must be updated to have the appropriate Article and Section reference (would now be Article XI Section 1) - housekeeping change, needs no vote but should be announced.*

Proposal #14.1

Bylaws Article X Section 2 State (Delegates)- Each Jewel Chapter in good standing with the Indiana State Council shall be represented by its President as delegate and one delegate for each ten jewel pin members or portion thereof. The President and other delegates shall not be allowed an alternate from their own chapter; other delegates may have an alternate. Delegates shall be selected by their chapter. No pledge may serve as a delegate. The Past Indiana Presidents Auxiliary shall receive one vote by the Chairman, or his/her proxy, if he/she is unable to attend the State Convention.

Reason: *remove the title Jewel, as any chapter made up of only pledges, is already ineligible to vote as stated in the sentence "no pledge may serve as a delegate". Allow for chapter president to have an alternate. At both MARC and IC level, the ISC President is allowed an alternate.*

Proposal #14.2

Indiana State Convention Standing Rules Rule #9 (must be approved if proposal #15.1 passes) Each chapter in good standing is allowed one (1) vote for the President and one (1) delegate for every ten (10) Jewel Pin members. The President and other delegates shall not be allowed an alternate from their own chapter No alternate can take the President's place. A delegate is allowed an alternate. The Past Indiana President's Auxiliary shall receive one vote by the Chairman, or his/her proxy, if he/she is unable to attend the State Convention.

Proposal #15

Bylaws Article XI Section 7 The chapter hosting the Annual State Convention shall submit to the President, The LAMP Editor, and the State Treasurer a financial report of the convention, in duplicate, thirty (30) days after the convention or prior to the end of the fiscal year. Annual Budget Meeting. The profit of the Annual State Convention shall be divided equally between the chapter(s) hosting and the Indiana State Council. The profit will accompany the report sent to the State Treasurer.

Reason: *change language to refer to fiscal year-end, rather than a meeting which has variable timing*

Proposal #16

Bylaws Article XII Fiscal Year The fiscal year of the organization shall begin on the first day of August July and end on July 31 June 30 of the following year.

Reason: *to bring fiscal year into alignment with ESA Membership Corporation and International Council practices and Tax Facts reporting period.*

Proposal #17

Bylaws Standing Rule #1 In the event of **the** death of an active Indiana ESA member, a floral tribute or donation to a charity not to exceed **donation in** the amount of twenty dollars (\$20.00) shall be **made** purchased or made by the local chapter **to a charity identified by the President of a member's chapter,** in the name of the Indiana State Council.

Reason: making a donation, rather than purchasing a floral tribute aligns better with our philanthropic purposes; removing the step for state to reimburse member's chapter provides for a more efficient process and a direct crediting of the gift

Proposal #18

Bylaws Article VII, Section 3; Subsection c

b. To cooperate with ESA **Membership Corporation** Headquarters in the organization of new chapters within the State of Indiana.

Reason: to reflect the name change, housekeeping

Proposal #19

Bylaws Article XIV Voting for State Purposes: Not Including Amendments or Elections

The State President must notify all Chapters 30 days in advance of a vote taking place at any **State** State Meeting. Voting shall take place as per Article XI, Section 2 of the State Bylaws.

Reason: Fix typo; housekeeping

Proposal #20.1

Constitution Article IV, Section c

The following officers shall be appointed by the President at the Annual State Convention: Corresponding Secretary, State Editor, State Chaplain, Senior St. Jude Coordinator, and Easter Seals Coordinator.

Reason: With the increasing difficulty of getting members to volunteer to hold an office and decrease in membership, this eliminates the need for a Senior and a Junior St. Jude Coordinator and the office is not as demanding as it once was to require a senior and junior coordinator. ESA Membership Corp and/or ESA International Council do not require/control states to have certain offices - some states do not even have St. Jude Coordinators at all.

Proposal #20.2

Bylaws Article III, Section 1

The President shall preside at all Council Meetings, appoint a Corresponding Secretary, State Editor of The LAMP, Chaplain, Senior St. Jude Coordinator, and Easter Seals Coordinator, all committees except the Nominating, Chapter Counseling, Elections, Philanthropic, Credentials, Constitution and Bylaws, and Awards Committees.

Reason: If the Constitution change passes, this falls with updating the Bylaws containing St. Jude Coordinator information.

Proposal #20.3

Bylaws Article IV, Section 4

The Senior St. Jude Coordinator shall be responsible for implementing fundraising for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Will maintain an accurate accounting record of all Indiana contributions to St. Jude Children's Research and report monthly to the Circle of Life ESA for St. Jude office. Shall work closely with the Junior St. Jude Coordinator to familiarize that coordinator with the duties of the Senior St. Jude Coordinator.

Reason: If the Constitution change passes, this falls with updating the Bylaws containing St. Jude Coordinator information. The ESA MC also has changed the name from Circle of Life, to ESA for St. Jude office.

Proposal #20.4

Bylaw Article V, Section 6 Action: Delete

The President, along with a committee of the First Vice President and appointed Senior St. Jude Coordinator, will appoint a Junior St. Jude Coordinator. The Junior St. Jude Coordinator shall work in close contact with the Senior St. Jude Coordinator, shall be familiar with all the duties of the Senior Coordinator. Shall become the Senior St. Jude Coordinator following term as Junior St. Jude Coordinator.

Reason: If the Constitution change passes, this eliminates the need for the section.

Proposed Changes to Executive Board Standing Rules

*Changes to the Executive Board Standing Rules are considered and approved by a vote of the Executive Board, not the general membership. Rather than in the previous format with "Now Reads" and "Change to Read" this updated format includes the original language in plain black text without underlines or strikethrough text. Reason: To bring into alignment with current operating procedures.

*Reason: formatting, housekeeping***Add:**Executive Board Standing Rule #18

An elected or appointed officer having a conflict of interest or conflict of responsibility on any matter involving the Indiana State Council and any other business or charitable entity or person shall refrain from voting on such matter. No officer, by design, shall use his/her position as an officer for his/her own direct or indirect financial gain.

Add:

These Standing Rules may be suspended, amended or rescinded at any meeting of the Executive Board, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Executive Board members present and voting, provided notice is given at least seven (7) days in advance.

Reason: of all the governing documents, this is only one that does not lay out a means for amending.

Rationale for the 7 days: Article VII Section 2, regarding Executive Board Meeting schedule and governance of special meetings and required notification.
