I thank the Lord for giving me the ability to do all that I do for my family, my chapter, the state board and my job. Thank you for the friendships and support.

Congratulations to all of the Chapters that brought me socks at Spring Conference. We donated 317 pairs of socks. Soldiers' Angels goal for this year is 15,000 pairs. Last year they collected 14,111. As of 2-27-19 they had already collected 4, 872. So with our donation they have met 33% of their goal for sure. I feel pretty confident they have probably received more in March and April. The instructions to use the Turn Around Fund are printed on the form. Please note that the ESAF Turn Around Fund cannot be used if ALSAC/St. Jude materials/supplies were provided for the event.

<u>ESA Fund Fest</u> – Each year at the start of International Convention the ESAF holds the Foundation Fund Fest. The event will be held on Tuesday July 16 in Memphis. The ESAF asks each state to provide an item for the auction that is held as part of the event. Diane Binkerd will be donating a Vera Bradley purse that will be the Indiana basket. *Would you and your chapter consider donating a gift card to be put in the "basket" for the auction item at International Convention? The gift card can be in any denomination and from a national chain of your choice. I will be collecting the gift card(s) at the Registration Area at State Convention in Ft. Wayne.* Thank you to everyone who brought gift cards to the Spring Conference for the ESA Fund Fest.

<u>Credentials Information</u> – ESAF Credentials will be available at the registration table at the state convention on Friday during convention registration hours. Each ESAF member will need to confirm if they will be attending IC convention or the member will need to have another *ESAF member* carry a proxy vote for them.

- If the ESAF member will be attending IC Convention you will need to "Vote" on the form that will be available at state convention.
- If the ESAF member is not attending, she should select "Proxy" on the form and list the name of the individual who will carry their proxy vote at IC convention. *This MUST be an ESAF member who is eligible to vote in the election*.
- Chapter and Councils votes are carried as "Proxy" votes. The individuals carrying the proxy vote does NOT need to be an ESAF member. The name of the individual carrying the proxy should be noted on the form that will be available at state convention.

Looking forward to seeing everyone in Fort Wayne on June 8th - 10th at the Indiana State Convention.


DELTA KAPPA- Franklin, Emma Ray
