


I hope this virus goes away soon so that we can get back to normal things and spend time with our families.






Zeta Eta - Danville - Jaycee Peak

Eta Pi looks forward to more opportunities to volunteer in the coming months with some fun socials planned for Thanksgiving and Christmas.





On behalf of my chapter sisters, I wish all a healthy and happy Christmas and may 2021 be a year of hope and joy.





Hello everyone and Happy Fall!

I know everyone is busy with their meetings, fundraisers, and RUSH memberships! I hope we will see several of our Indiana Chapters in attendance at the virtual ESA Family Feud event on Friday, November 6th! Our membership is very important and vital to keep ESA going. If you need some new assistance for rush events, please be sure to visit ESA International website under the Membership category for lots of ideas, instructions and success stories. Your IC officers and ESA Headquarters are here to assist to you in every way.

President Brenda forwarded to the Chapter Presidents and Indiana Council Board the proposed ESA International Council Bylaws recommendations for your review, discussion and sharing with the members. Due to circumstances that arose after the distribution to the State Chapter Presidents and Past International Council Presidents, the proposed IC Bylaws recommendations have been withdrawn. The proposed recommendations have been removed from the ESA International website and there will be NO voting in March. The IC Board has proposed the following recommendation to be voted on at the IC Convention in July.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTIONS

Section 2. Ballot Vote and Nominations from the Floor

NOW READS: Officers shall be elected by ballot vote at the annual meeting. Nominations may be made from the floor for all offices with the exception of President. "Notice of Intent to Nominate" from the floor shall be submitted in writing to the First Vice President, 60 days prior to International Convention. Candidates so nominated must conform to provisions of Article V. and shall have three minutes to have their qualifications presented. Nominations for each office shall not exceed five. Balloting shall begin after the close of the First General Assembly.

PROPOSED RECOMMENDATION:


ARTICLE VI - ELECTIONS

Section 2. Voting

Candidates shall be elected according to a preferential electronic voting system approved by the Executive Board.

Last July every ESA member in good standing with an email address was eligible to vote for the IC Candidates through Election Runner (voting system). There were 5821 ESA members eligible to vote last July, however, only approximately 1583 members voted through Election Runner for the IC Candidates.

I have been a member of ESA for fifty (50) years and over the years, I have had the question posed to me "What does ESA do for me?" As is the voting with our own state elections, it is based on delegates per chapter members. Due to COVID-19, canceling the IC Convention in person and put on virtually through a Zoom meeting. The IC Candidates voting was cast by ESA members in good standing. Those of you that are/were ESA members paid your IC dues and were in good standing, you were provided the opportunity to vote as an ESA member not as a delegate from your chapter/state. Therefore, in the history of my 50 years as an ESA member it has NEVER happened for members to cast the vote on their own. If you have any questions regarding the IC Candidates, please reach out to an Indiana member or IC Council Board member for information. No one will tell you HOW TO CAST your VOTE; only provide pertinent information for your decision to cast YOUR VOTE.

As with our State Bylaws, the IC Bylaws are on the ESA International website and you have the opportunity to submit a change to IC Parliamentarian, Celeste Webb by no later than January 1, 2021. I have provided below Celeste's contact information for your convenience.



Celeste will have an updated article in the next IC President's Newsletter with respect to the IC Bylaw that President Brenda may wish to share with our Chapter Presidents.

I am happy to report that the 2021 IC Convention Planning Committee met virtually on October 31st, which by my office as IC Workshop Coordinator I am a member of the Planning Committee. I can guarantee you the IC Convention Planning Committee, IC Executive Board and ESA Headquarters are going forward with planning the 2021 IC Convention in Louisville, KY to be in PERSON on July 24th – August 1st! The 2021 IC Convention theme is "Talk Derby with ESA" to be held at the Marriott Downtown, Louisville, KY. The Member Full Registration Fee postmarked by May 1, 2021 is \$250. Room rate at the Marriott Downtown will be \$175 plus taxes for a total \$203.12, which is inclusive for a double, triple or quad in the room. The IC Convention Registration Form will be available on the ESA International website within the end of this week (November 6th). There is NO SHUTTLE service from the airport to the Marriott. The Marriott is approximately 8-10 minutes from the airport.

Please NOTE that the COVID rules and regulations exercised in Louisville, KY at this time, will be handled accordingly by the Marriott for the safety of everyone attending the IC Convention. At the present time, there will be no theater seating during the convention. There will be four (4) people seated to a round table throughout the convention for all meetings, installation and events.

Please reach out to one of the Executive Committee members on the attached list to volunteer your ideas and time for the 2022 IC Convention in Indiana, you will not want to miss this!




I have learned to be more involved in ESA's three fold purpose, Education, Philanthropic and Social.




