


formed. My favorite sport to play is volleyball and to watch is football (go Colts!).






My husband and I now share our first grandchild, 1 yr old “Hudson” who we hope will be participating in sports in the future.







I'm excited to be involved with the Association of the Arts for 2021-2022. Please reach out if you have any questions, or suggestions..






