We have a proposed bylaw change! Article X Section 1D

Currently reads:

d. The incoming State President's registration (includes hotel) and travel expenses to attend the State President's Annual Leadership Seminar. The travel expenses would include: \*round trip flight or mileage according to the current non-profit mileage rate if driving; \*and meals, excluding alcohol. If the incoming State President is unable to attend, the incoming 1st Vice President may attend as representation.

Change to read:

d. The incoming State President's registration and travel expenses to attend the State President's Annual Leadership Seminar. The travel expenses would include: \*round trip flight or mileage according to the current non-profit mileage rate if driving; \*half of the total hotel room cost (including the night prior and the night(s) during the conference), \*and meals, excluding alcohol. If the incoming State President is unable to attend, the incoming 1st Vice President may attend as representation.

Reason for change:

Leadership no longer includes the hotel cost within registration.

#### ESA Foundation Chair – Mary Brewer

Greetings Indiana ESA members!

I hope everyone is doing well and is looking forward to sunnier days this Spring! Here is an update on all things ESAF – please reach out directly if you have any questions.

The scholarship application window closed on February 1st. Indiana received applications for all of its scholarships! The ESAF board has mailed out 2023 Fantasy Event 'Texas Toast' post cards as a virtual ESAF fundraising event. Post cards were mailed to ESAF members in early February.

The Foundation Fund Fest at IC convention will be held on Tuesday night, July 25th, as the kickoff for the Convention. The committee will be asking states for donations, and we expect to have more information to share at our Spring Conference, as the Foundation Board meets this week.

ESA Foundation annual dues are now \$40. The contribution forms on the website, in the membership newsletter, and the online dues payment ESAF Dues have been updated with the new amount. If any of of our Indiana members missed the deadline, you can pay the \$40 now to be sure you are ahead of the deadline for next year. Dues paid in 2023 will ensure member voting privileges in 2024.

Chapters are encouraged to use the Turnaround Funds when disbursing their chapter funds. This is an easy way to support the Foundation. The turnaround funds donation form is its own form and is available on the contribution page of the ESAF website.

#### Benefits and highlights include:

Rather than sending individual checks to one or more 501c3 charities, the individual sends one check to the Foundation indicating which charity is to receive what amount. The Foundation turns around this request and sends individual checks back to the person using the turnaround funds. Then the person sends the checks to the individual charities.

**Benefit**: Easier to document donations on your taxes (donations to one charity instead of multiples) Item to remember: Checks are returned to the individual, not the charity, so the individual needs to send them on to the charity.

**Note**: In order to better track ESAF contributions, Headquarters is asking for Turnaround funds to be sent in a separate check from other ESA donations, i.e., dues, grant or endowment donations. Hope to see everyone at the Spring Conference on March 18th!
