See everyone in Fort Wayne on September 22nd!



You will notice, however, when you click on any of the links and you are not logged in to the website, you'll get a message that you need to be logged in to view that content. This is something that I've implemented after looking around at other ESA state websites and had noticed that most of them include a similar Members-Only section. It cleans up our site and protects our information from anyone who may come across the website. You will need a member account to access all content under the 'More' menu. I will cross-reference all member accounts with our chapter rosters to be sure that only Indiana ESA members have accounts.

To create your member account, hover over 'Member Login' and then click 'Registration'.



On the Registration page, fill out your information such as your preferred username, email address, and preferred password. Click 'Register 'once you've entered all of your information.

Once you've registered, you'll receive an email with your login information and you can then log in to the website by clicking on 'Member Login' in the menu. Once logged in, you'll be able to view and download all forms, chapter rosters, bylaws, and award certificate templates.


