CAMP RILEY VISIT - Camp Riley hosted an Indiana ESA Day in April, 2019. an opportunity for ESA to visit Bradford Woods for the first time in several years. In the past when we have visited, we have been able to interact with the children attending camp. This visit did not include visiting with the children. This was a disappointment to me because I enjoyed seeing some of the children that our efforts have benefited. I thought to myself, why go? I've seen Bradford Woods many times, why go again? I'll tell you why. There are so many good things happening at Camp Riley all the time. It made me proud to see what ESA has provided to Camp Riley, the buildings, the amphitheater, the walking trail, and on and on. I saw aspects of the Camp that I had not seen before. We toured the Interpretive Center, the Amphitheater, viewed the zip line in action, went into one of the cabins to see where the campers stay, went into the Dining Hall, and visited one of the original campsites and dining hall. It was very small indeed, but gave a perspective on how far Camp Riley has come. What I felt on this visit was that ESA is truly valued by the people involved on a daily basis with Camp Riley. A profound statement was made while we were on our tour. The staff at Camp Riley kept saying that they wanted to make the Camp more accessible to ESA. A remark was made to the effect that it doesn't really matter if we see it or not, as long as the kids get to experience it. That's right everyone. It is not about us, it is about the kids. And that is why we do what we do. We have supported Camp Riley in many ways over the past 52 years. We have outdone ourselves in providing the supplies that are needed. In fact, it was mentioned that they will never have to purchase construction paper again, as we have fully supplied that need. It was also mentioned to us that if there are larger purchases on the Camp Riley Wish List that it would be very helpful if we were to supply funds and designate what you would like purchased. Camp Riley's kids' needs are so specific, there are so many regulations that have to be followed, and Camp Riley has "contacts" to obtain what they need. What they don't have is the money designated to purchase the items. So my take from that conversation is that while camperships need to be funded, it would also be a good plan of action to send money designated to go toward some of the bigger items on the Wish List.

We look forward to seeing many of you at the Fall Conference on September $21^{\rm st}$ in Terre Haute!




