New Orleans facts:

When most people picture a voodoo doll, they think of Hollywood movies with witch doctors, black magic and painful pins. However, Voodoo is a rich and diverse spiritual religion practiced still to this day in NOLA. Voodoo dolls are not instruments of Evil, they are instruments of intent. The dolls are a focus tool for prayers, spells and meditations. There are many types of Voodoo dolls for all purposes, such as love, healing, empowerment, guidance or fertility. The color of the doll is the indicator of its intended purpose. For example, if the doll is dressed in white the intent is positive for purification or healing. If

the doll is in green the intent will focus on growth, wealth, money and fertility. If the doll is in blue like this one, its intended purpose is for peach and tranquility. It is believed if you pin something personal to the doll such as a lock of hair or a possession of the person who the doll represents this will create a stronger connection and make the message clearer to the Spirits.

"That must be where I am going wrong. I'll have to put a pair of scissors in my purse too. Snip a lock." So, the person this doll represents can find much needed peace.

First Vice President Brenda Campbell:

Good morning. My name is Brenda Campbell and I have had the honor of serving you as 1st. VP and membership chair this year.

In the spirit "Laissez les Bon Temps Rouler."

Though Mardi Gras began as early as 1699 it wasn't until 1857 that the model for future parades was established. The New Orleans's Clubs, the Mystick Krewe of Comus, or krews, put on the first parade with themed floats and the wearing of masks, among other things.

*It was in 1920 that they began throwing beads. The colors of the beads have significance: The purple represents justice; the green symbolizes faith and the gold exemplifies power. The throwing of the beads signifies the krews granting of justice, faith and powers to all who catch the beads.

* It is illegal to wear masks in New Orleans except on Mardi Gras. The masquerade is a service as an opportunity to shed their inhibitions and fully imbibe in the party spirit.
