On Friday, October 8 the Leadership theme was “Heroes Helping Heroes” The Workshop speakers were: Susan Moellinger and Jennifer Garrison, Co-Founders of Passageways. Passageways was formed in the hearts of Jennifer and Susan in 2014 with a vision to impact the lives of heroes (military veterans) who were living on the streets. At that time there was nothing available in Wichita, KS, so the team went to work on finding a way to fill this gap in services.

Alan Stoll and Gary Bowker, Winfield Fire Department. Alan and Gary are retired from the Winfield Fire Department, each with over 30 years of fire service. Both are former fire chiefs and are certified in several disciplines. We learned about the latest research on fire detection and suppression to improve fire prevention in your home, as well as life safety. October is Fire Prevention Month.

Karina Perkins, CEO & President of Heartspring. Heartspring has been a leader and innovator in services for children with special needs and their families since it was founded in 1934 as the Institute of Logopedics. While the organization’s face and name have changed over the years, its dedication to the mission of helping children with special needs find greater independence has remained constant.

Immediately following the lunch our Keynote Speaker, Laura Schmidt presented her “notes to self”[®]. As a mentor, entrepreneur and mother, Laura learned firsthand the important of speaking with positivity and encouragement to others. In her free time, she hungrily sought out books, advice, and mentors who would help her become the best, most positive version of herself. As her belief in the power of positivity grew, Laura wanted to share her message with the world: that *words make all the difference*. So, when an idea struck in 2011 to put positive affirmations on the toes of socks, she took off running. Nine years and plenty of hard work later, Laura has built “notes to self,”[®] which her children call “a sock empire.” To date, “notes to self,”[®] llc has donated more than 89,000 pairs of socks to homeless shelters, women’s shelters and children in need.

The proposed MARC Budget was approved with the \$0.58 tax rate for mileage reimbursement. The proposed Bylaw Changes and Standing Rule Changes were approved.

Greetings to all and hope everyone is enjoying the chapter year and gearing up for the holiday season!

Here are some highlights and information about the ESA Foundation presented at the Fall Conference.

Scholarships:

- ESAF is a public Foundation – the scholarship program is open to everyone. It is also available to any ESA member, their relatives and friends, but the ESA Foundation can show absolutely no favoritism, not even the appearance of it!
- The Program kicked off on September 1, 2021 and deadline for completed applications is 11PM Mountain Time on February 1, 2022

Turnaround Funds:

- Important to the Foundation to help strengthen its 501c3 status
- Rather than sending individual checks to one or more 501c3 charities, the individual sends one check to the Foundation indicating which charity is to receive what amount. The Foundation turns around this request and sends individual checks back to the person using the turnaround funds. Then the person sends the checks to the individual charities.
- Please note: Checks are returned to the donor, not to the charity, so the donor needs to send them on to the charity.
- In 2020, Indiana placed 1st as the State Giving the Most Money to Turnaround Funds – \$26,304

Easterseals has a commitment from several key businesses to provide opportunities for training, employment and a career path for participants within their companies.


New Corporate Partner
