St. Jude \$50 for 50 Challenge

If you haven't heard yet, this year is 50 years together for ESA & St. Jude! Every state is being challenged to make 50 (or more!) \$50 donations to St. Jude during 2022.

Through December, mem are encouraged to make as many \$50 donations (or donations in \$50 increments). ESA Headquarters will track these donations by state and the winning state receives a very special prize at their 2023 State Convention. (We can win this!)

Rules:

- The money raised for this challenge must be NEW money - not funds from a chapter's yearly St. Jude event or annual donation that they were already planning on making.
- Credit events will not count - this is a cash fundraiser.
- ESA Headquarters must notified for be anv that should donation toward count this fundraiser. Mailed checks should arrive with a note in the memo line. If



filling out a Completed Event Form (online or paper) be sure to indicate the donation is a \$50 for 50 event. Note: there is a new printable Completed Event Form on the ESA website - be sure to use that one, the old forms do not have this event option

- ESA will not retroactively count donations toward this campaign, so make sure it is clear that the donation should be counted.
- NEVER mail cash convert all cash to a check. Donations should be made in increments of \$50, and Headquarters will track these donations for your state. Headquarters will not keep track of r donations, so hold those until they equal \$50.
- All checks should be made out to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and mailed to ESA Headquarters. Checks mailed directly to the hospital will not be tracked.

- ESA Foundation is an AmazonSmile member, simply sign up at smile.amazon.com and select ESA Foundation.
- Turnaround Funds this is a simple way to support our ESA Foundation:
- Rather than sending individual checks to one or more 501(c)3 charities, the individual sends one check to the Foundation indicating which charity is to receive what amount. The Foundation turns around this request and sends the individual check(s) back to the person using the turnaround funds. Then the person sends the checks to the individual charities. Note: Checks are returned to the donor, not to the charity, so the donor needs to send them on to the charity.

Membership Options and Dues:

- Annual dues are expected to be received at ESA Headquarters before March 1st
- General membership is just as important as Life Active Membership.
- Members of the Foundation do not need to be ESA members!
- It is only \$25 to join and \$15 per year annually.
