The 37th Annual Midwest Area Regional Council (MARC) Conference was held in Tulsa, Oklahoma, on October 7-8, 2022. This year's theme was <u>Get Your Kicks on Route 66</u>. The Oklahoma State Council proved to be a wonderful host for the conference with their friendliness and helpfulness to make sure everyone felt welcome.

Jan and I would like to give a huge THANK YOU to Peggy Zimmer for donating the Coach purse and wallet that was auctioned and all the members of Indiana ESA for contributing gift cards for the purse which helped in the bidding. Our purse raised \$550. Total Ways & Means raised during the conference was \$4,025. Indiana Rocks!

The first day of the conference started with leadership. The first class welcomed News 6 Anchor Lori Fullbright. Lori used her 30 years of experience to provide us with tips for protecting ourselves from predators with a serious, yet fun approach. She made us aware of the necessity of being familiar with our surroundings and the importance of developing a plan of action before an incident occurs. She made us feel empowered verses fearful of a possible incident. Lori even provided us with whistles as a means of protection at the end of the session.

The next speakers were from the Child Abuse Network (CAN). This group spoke of how to spot and report child abuse with emphasis on the importance of saying something to help children in their time of need. They also explained their individual roles and how they are important in helping a child navigate the system. There are many things you should and shouldn't do to help a child in an abusive situation.

The last speaker for the day was Dr. Michael Horton of The Coffee Bunker. He provided everyone information on how The Coffee Bunker helps veterans, as well as inviting a mother of a former veteran to come and tell her son's journey after deployment. It was very eye opening and heartfelt. At the end, Dr. Horton provided everyone information and discussed the possibility of 'a coffee bunker' in our hometowns to provide opportunities to serve our local veterans.

Saturday morning opened with our flag ceremony, Celebration of Life ceremony, and a welcome from 2021-22 President Kim Poling. Roll call was taken by state and minutes from the July 2022 meeting were approved. Treasurer's report is as follows:

By Law/Standing Rule change was voted and approved. Treasurer's proposed budget was declined on first vote. With a few modifications suggested to reduce travel expenses for upcoming year and a modification to a current by-law, the new proposed budget was passed.

Finally, Courtney Ginder and I will be planning a virtual educational with a tour of the new Indiana ESA website so please look out for additional information on that.






